¹ Just FYI, the reason Levi turns the engine on and then off again before changing the oil is that the used oil drains faster if it's heated up by the engine first. The used oil is black and the fresh oil has an almost translucent yellow-green color to it. The used oil drains into a pan or bucket and will get on Levi's hands and arms, which he's used to, and wipes off with a rag.

DOUG
